Working in Partnership

The Four Host First Nations (FHFN) and the Vancouver Organizing Committee for the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games (VANOC) have been working closely together to achieve unprecedented Aboriginal Participation in the 2010 Winter Games. These efforts include the engagement of First Nations, Inuit and Métis across Canada. Four kinds of instruments are being used to formalize these relationships: Memoranda of Understanding, Memoranda of Intent, Government Cooperation Agreements and Statements of Cooperation.
